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## **NORTH THURSTON EDUCATION FOUNDATION 2019 APPLICATION FORM AND INSTRUCTIONS**

The North Thurston Education Foundation offers scholarships to graduating seniors to assist in financing their post-high school education in the 2019-20 school year. In addition to graduating from a North Thurston Public School, applicants must have demonstrated (1) the skills necessary to succeed in their chosen post-secondary school; (2) good citizenship and leadership qualities; and (3) a need for financial assistance to meet their educational goals. Foundation scholarships vary in amounts awarded but the total value of each scholarship is no less than \$2,000. Most scholarships are one year grants, but some are renewable for either two or four years based on the recipient's academic progress. The Foundation awards the following scholarships, many in memory of important individuals who served our community. Scholarships are awarded for those attending community colleges, vocational or technical schools or colleges or universities.

- a. **Davies Vocational-Technical Scholarship: -- for those pursuing a vocational or technical career**
- b. **John Gott Educational Scholarship – for those pursuing a career in education**
- c. **Jeannette Hostetter Ford Memorial Scholarship – for students studying history or education**
- d. **Lisa Corwin Memorial Scholarship for students attending college in the East or Midwest**
- e. **Frank Parker Memorial Scholarship – for those pursuing a career in math or science**
- f. **Alex Ward Memorial Scholarship (NTHS only) -- preference given to student athletes**
- g. **Lewis and Edna Hawthorne Memorial Scholarship (4 awarded) -- for NTHS and Timberline students only**
- h. **Roy Pedersen Memorial Scholarship**
- i. **James Koval Memorial Scholarship**
- j. **Charles Callahan Memorial Scholarship – for those pursuing a career in education**
- k. **Sue Shannon Scholarship**
- l. **Nicholas T. Walker Memorial Scholarship – preference given to Timberline students**
- m. **Colton Thorstrom-Smith Memorial Scholarship**
- n. **General Foundation Scholarships (multiple scholarships awarded)**

**To apply for a scholarship, you must submit the following to your high school counseling office or by U. S. mail to the Foundation no later than Friday, April 12, 2019. Late applications will not be accepted.**

1. A completed and SIGNED application form, including all information requested, with your name on any attachments.
2. An official signed and sealed transcript through the first semester of your senior year.
3. A copy of your electronic FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR) that you received from the Federal Government.
4. **Letters of recommendation**, as follows:
  - a) One from a teacher or counselor that documents your scholarship, leadership and citizenship qualities and potential for success in post-high school education; and
  - b) One from a member of the community **who is NOT employed in your school or related to you**, describing your leadership and community service in non-school related activity or activities in the community.
5. **Essay requirement.** Your application must include a short (no more than 500 words) essay that describes you, your accomplishments, your goals, challenges you have faced and how those challenges have affected your goals. The Committee will review your application, transcript and letters of recommendation; this essay will let the Committee get to know you as a person so please include any information you would like the scholarship committee to consider. You will be considered for any of the scholarships listed above for which you are eligible, but you should be sure to include any information that you believe indicates that you are particularly suited for a specific scholarship.

**Failure to include any of these documents will result in your application being disqualified.**
