Greetings from The Board of Trustees

Thank you to our contributors for your support and generosity in 2014 and over the years. Because of your commitment, the North Thurston Education Foundation meets its goal for helping students in North Thurston Public Schools. In 1991 the Board conducted a needs survey that identified \$55,000 in annual unmet needs and set a goal of \$100,000. For the first time, in 2014, the Foundation exceeded \$100,000 in support to students in the district through our three major programs: Student Assistance Grants, Scholarships, and Learning Improvement Grants. The assets of the Foundation now total \$2.5 million. Thanks to our community and the district for helping us grow. We appreciate you.

Recap of the 2015 Annual Meeting

The annual meeting was held on January 27, 2015, at the Gott Administration Center. Foundation accomplishments in 2014 were highlighted. The details appear in the annual report in this newsletter. New Fundraising Opportunities

In 2014 the NTEF registered with the AmazonSmile organization to receive donations from customers who select the Foundation. Individuals making purchases through Amazon may go on line under AmazonSmile and select the North Thurston Education Foundation to receive a percentage of the amount of the eligible purchase, at no cost to donor. To shop at AmazonSmile one may simply go to smile.amazon.com from a web browser on a computer or mobile device. On the first visit to AmazonSmile (smile.amazon.com), a donor needs to select a charitable organization to receive donations from eligible purchases before beginning to shop.

In February 2015, the NTEF applied to the Fred Meyer Community Rewards Program. The application was approved. In December Trustees of the Lewis and Edna Hawthorne trust donated \$430,034 to the Foundation to establish scholarships for graduating seniors from North Thurston High School and Timberline High School. Details regarding the implementation of the awards will be available for scholarship applications in 2016.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Thanks to the generous support of you—our 417 contributing members—the North Thurston Education Foundation continued to carry out its mission of supporting North Thurston students in need during 2014 through four key programs: student assistance grants that enable schools to meet students' unique needs; the McGimpsey Pantries that provide weekend and summer food assistance for low income students; scholarships to graduating seniors to help defray the cost of post-high school education and training; and learning improvement grants to enhance teachers' ability to help their students succeed. Total program support for the year was \$100,965, while administrative expenditures for insurance, accounting, printing, postage, fees, maintenance of website, supplies, and fund raising costs for 2014 were \$16,459. Total income from all donors and events in 2014 was \$557,246. All revenue goes directly to support the Foundation mission as the Foundation Board, officers and Executive Director are all volunteers, and the Foundation does not use professional fundraisers.

PROGRAMS SUPPORTING STUDENTS

Student Assistance Grants

Twenty-one District sites, including one for each school and one for the District-at-large, receive annual student assistance grants to provide for emergency needs of students. The amounts of the grants for the 2014-2015 school year were as follows: \$1200 for each elementary school, \$1500 for each middle school and South Sound High School and \$2000 for the large high schools and District Office site. The school assistance grant funds, excluding Pantries, disbursed during the 2014 calendar year totaled \$41,150. Students received help with school fees, clothing, rental for music equipment, school supplies and other personal and educational needs. The allocated funds are given at the beginning of each school year; schools may request additional funds depending on student needs. Special funds are also available in exceptional circumstances to help reduce obstacles that students face in getting their education. Because funds are managed according to school policies, school principals, counselors, secretaries or intervention specialists may be contacted about use of the funds. The Foundation also provided \$1,500 to the GRAVITY Dropout Re-engagement Program which serves students from North Thurston Public Schools among others. The funds are used for personal and educational needs of these students to help them continue their education.

McGimpsey Pantries

Implemented in 2007-2008, as an extension of the Student Assistance Grants, the Foundation established the McGimpsey Pantries in middle and high schools. The Pantries provide food and toiletries for homeless students and others who need this help. Each secondary school receives \$500 in the fall and additional funds as needed. Elementary schools are served through another backpack food program. Information for accessing these items is

available in each school. This year, for the third time, the Foundation provided funds to the Lacey Boys and Girls Club for a summer Pantry program. A total of \$5,500 was disbursed to stock the Pantries in 2014.

Scholarships for Graduating Seniors

During 2014 the Foundation awarded twenty scholarships, plus two renewals, totaling \$43,000 in eight different scholarship categories. Five named scholarships are endowed to honor or to remember former students, teachers, administrators and others as established by the donors: the Lisa Corwin Memorial Scholarship; the Jeannette Hostetter Ford Memorial Scholarship; the John Gott Educational Scholarship and the Alex Ward Memorial and Frank Parker Memorial Scholarships. The Foundation awards two additional designated scholarships: the Violet Davies Vocational/Technical Scholarship and the Roy Pedersen Memorial Scholarship. Also, our community's support enabled the Foundation to award an additional 15 NTEF Scholarships. Most scholarship recipients were awarded one-time grants of \$2,000 each; the Corwin Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 is awarded for the first year of post high school study and can be renewed for up to three years for a possible total of \$4,000. Learning Improvement Grants

Educators in North Thurston Public Schools are awarded mini-grants for use in schools and classrooms to assist in the improvement of student learning. By mid-year \$7,932.93 was expended for the grants for the 2014-2015 school year. The Learning Improvement Grants, given annually since 1996, meet one of the Foundation's goals and are designed to encourage innovation and improvement of learning. Grant recipients are asked to report to the Foundation Trustees and membership at the Annual meeting and are required to submit a written report of their action research. The reports reflect project activities, benefits to students in evidence of their learning, and "lessons learned" as educators. A committee reviews the applications and selects the winners. The Foundation selected the following projects for funding in 2014-2015:

COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Membership

Membership for the calendar year 2014, based on identified contributors, totaled more than 417. Organizations are counted as a single member. According to the bylaws, all donations of \$25 or more qualify contributors for membership and to vote to elect Trustees at the annual membership meeting. Donations received through the NTPS district payroll, Washington State Employees Combined Fund Drive, as well as through fundraisers, are listed by name when identified. Categories of contributing members, eligible to vote, are Member \$25-99, Supporting Member \$100-249, Sustaining Member \$250-499, Principal's Club \$500-999, Superintendent's Club \$1,000-4,999. Foundation Benefactor \$5,000 and above. A student category is \$5.

Revenue Generated, Awards Disbursed

The Foundation Trustees measure achievement by both the number of contributors and revenue generated by the Foundation as well as by the program disbursements that benefit students, staff, and activities in North Thurston Public Schools. The 2014 contributions and fund raising for all funds, including annual, endowment, special designated funds, and in-kind donations, but excluding investment and interest earnings, totaled \$557,246. Entertainment was provided by members of the North Thurston High School Orchestra under the direction of **Grant Sears**.

LEADERSHIP and GOVERNANCE

**Executive Committee -
 Carletta Garraway, President / Chair**

The Executive Committee of the Foundation Board serves as the administrative committee. The committee met monthly to plan meetings of the Board of Trustees and to handle business that occurred throughout the year. The Executive Committee made recommendations on these business matters to the full Board.

The Executive Committee prepared three newsletters for the Foundation in 2014 including the 2013 annual report. Kathy Tingvall provided design services; REV mailing of Kent, Washington, donated mailing services (NTEF paid the postage only); and South Bay Press did the printing of newsletters as well as luncheon programs. In the fall, after REV Mailing owner retired, the Foundation applied for and received non-profit mailing status for USPS and began using The Mailbox of Olympia for mailing services.

The Executive Committee prepared the 2015 budget, which was adopted by the Board in November 2014. The Board approved the continu-

ation of funding levels for the grants as follows: \$1,200 for elementary schools, \$1,500 for middle schools and South Sound High School, and \$2,000 for the large high schools and the district support fund. The new budget also recognizes funding for the Lacey Boys and Girls Club and the GRAVITY program for re-engagement of dropout as categories under the Student Assistance Grants. Learning Improvement Grants for 2015 will continue to be \$2,000 each. Up to eight Learning Grants will be given. The Board also budgeted a contingency fund to be used should the decision be made to hire a part-time executive director or other staff; however, no such decision has been made.

The Executive Committee guided special events in 2014 focused on strategic planning and transition as Sue Shannon plans to retire. For the second year, facilitators **Robert Humes** and **Sean Murphy** donated their skills to assist with workshops in June and July that included current Board members. A position description was developed and announced at the Partners for Kids Luncheon. Applications for the volunteer Executive Director position will be due on January 15, 2015. A five-member selection committee was formed to recruit, review applications, interview applicants, check references and make a recommendation to the Board of Trustees.

The 2014 Executive Committee included the elected officers and a member-at-large: **Carletta Garraway**, president; **Laura Lynn**, vice president resource development; **Steve Capps**, vice president resource management; **Jack Arend**, vice president awards and disbursements, **Dorothy Adamson**, member-at-large; **Sue Shannon**, executive director. The Foundation Board also amended the Bylaws this year to enhance continuity of service by increasing the term of office of the vice president resource management/treasurer to three years beginning in 2015. Terms of other officers remain one year. There are no term limits for officers, who must be members of the Board of Trustees.

**Investment Committee -
 Lee Blankenship, Chair**

The Investment Committee met quarterly in 2014 to review the status of the investment accounts. Greg Stapp, Stapp Financial Planning, LLC, served as investment advisor. Mr. Stapp is a Registered Investment Advisor (RIA), Series 65. The Investment Committee continued to make recommendations to the Board of Trustees regarding investments, disposition of Certificates of Deposit, and other related activities within the parameters of the investment policies of the Foundation. The Investment Committee met jointly with the NTEF Board of Trustees for the April meeting. The meeting gave the Board members and Committee members the opportunity to meet one another and for the Board to hear the quarterly report presented by Greg Stapp. Although the markets continued to be somewhat volatile in 2014, the Foundation year-end balances were favorable. Also, because some donors have designated contributions to be used as needed, rather than invested in permanent endowment accounts, the Foundation was able to meet its program goals.

**Audit Committee -

The Audit Committee did not complete an audit in 2014 for fiscal year 2013. Audits will resume next year.

**School Visitation Committee -
 Cindy Coble, Coordinator**

The School Visitation Committee, composed of NTEF Board member teams, continued a schedule of school visits this year. The focus of the presentations was to highlight the amounts of the Student Assistance Grants provided to each school and how to access and use the funds. We also encouraged district staff to join NTEF as contributing members. After all, we all want to support our students. Presentations were made at the district's 21 schools prior to Winter Break. Thank you to the Board members and others who volunteered and made presentations this year: **Cindy Coble, Bill Williams, Cynthia Pratt, Dorn Barr, Heather Hettinger, Erica Van Lierop, Carletta Garraway, and Liz Squires**, former Board member.

**Grants Committee -
 Jack Arend**

The Grants Committee oversees Foundation grant projects including the Student Assistance Grants and Learning Improvement Grants. Special Enrichment and Recognition and Needs Grants are occasionally funded. Nisqually Middle School received assistance to complete a greenhouse project in 2014 in the amount of \$808.46. Committee members included **Jack Arend, Tom MacRobert, Cindy Coble, Carletta Garraway, and Debby Gaffney**.

**Scholarship Committee -
 Dorn Barr and Bill Williams, co-Chairs**

The Scholarship Committee is responsible for the review and revision of scholarship procedures and selection of scholarship recipients. The new scholarships Alex Ward Memorial Scholarship and the Frank Parker Memorial Scholarship were awarded in 2014. Both scholarships have an initial award of \$2,000 and may be renewed for \$1,750 a year for up to three years, for a possible total to the recipients of \$7,250. A generous donation of more than \$430,000 was received in December from the Lewis and Edna Hawthorne Trust. The funds will be used to establish a scholarship at each Timberline High School and at North Thurston High School for graduating seniors. Details and procedures for awarding the scholarships will be developed in the months ahead; scholarships will likely be awarded in 2016.
